





Important information

Please note that as of **2024**, **final balances** for extended tours will be due **45 days before** leaving not 30 days. With tourism in Australia so busy, the motels now require final numbers 30 days out and whatever rooms are held at that date is what we have to pay for, so we need all payments finalized prior to this date for planning purposes. We regret to have to do this but our suppliers dictate such terms.

We would also like to explain what our "full bus" policy is. On an extended tour, even though it will be a 48 seater coach, we never fill every seat on purpose and generally cap the limit at around 30 passengers for comfort and convenience of our travellers.

If you are travelling on an extended tour as a single traveller **we guarantee** you will have a single room to yourself, however we can not guarantee you will have a single seat to yourself on the coach as naturally we can't do tours that are only half full.

On a day tour we cap the "full limit" at around 38 passengers on a large coach.

Naracoorte & The Scenic South East

Monday 5th to Thursday 8th February 2024 - 4 Days

Accommodation: William MacIntosh Motor Inn, Naracoorte

Highlights of the tour:

- ★ Head down to the beautiful South East making the first stop, for morning tea at Mt Barker.
- ★ Visit the town of Kingston and have an opportunity to have your photo taken with "Larry" the Lobster who stands 17 metres high and is now home to Janet's Takeaway.
- ★ Drive around Cape Jaffa and see the historic lighthouse which was originally 41 metres high and known as a Wells Screw Pile designed to suit the local conditions.
- ★ Spend the day exploring Mt Gambier. Visit "The Lady Nelson" Visitor Information Centre. The Lady Nelson was a 60-ton sailing vessel built in the year 1799. It was the first ship to sail along the coastline of SA.
- ★ Visit the cave gardens in the centre of town and then explore the Riddoch Arts and Cultural Centre. See the wonderful film, "Volcano- the story of Earth, Fire and Water", which explains the Aboriginal Dreamtime story of how the craters were formed and also how the spectacular volcanic eruptions shaped Mount Gambier.
- ★ Drive around the Blue Lake, Valley Lake and the Adam Lindsey Gordon Obelisk, which was erected as a memorial to the famous Australian poet.
- ★ Head to Umpherston Sink Hole. See the stunning garden and its picturesque landscape from the viewing platforms or walk into the sinkhole along the terraces and behind the hanging vines.
- ★ Visit the Tantanoola Caves, which are easily accessible. Learn how the caves were found, their history and the geology of these stunning caves.
- ★ Travel to the town of Millicent and see the unusual swimming lake. Visit the pretty seaside towns of Beachport and Robe. Have free time to explore both towns. Walk to the Obelisk at Robe or just enjoy the bus tour of the marina, wharf and Long Beach.
- ★ Visit the World Heritage listed Naracoorte Caves; one of the worlds most important fossil sites and venture down into Alexandra Cave.
- ★ Discover the Wonambi Fossil Centre, and see the re-creation of the megafauna that roamed the landscape over 500,000 years ago.

- ★ See the night time show, "Aura" at Sovereign Hill. Explore the creation, discovery and impact of gold on the past and present. The gritty story of gold, rebellion, gunfights, triumphs and tragedies will show the drama of Ballarat's history.
- ★ Spend time at the Ballarat Begonia Festival, which has the rarest collection of begonias in the Southern hemisphere. See over 500 varieties and 1000 beautiful begonia flowers. Wander around at your leisure, listen to the live music, watch the performances and the Begonia Festival Parade and be entertained by the celebrity chefs.
- ★ See, "'A Very Fine Yarn" exhibition and go shopping at the Creswick Woollen Mill, the only coloured woollen spinning mill in Australia.
- ★ Learn the fascinating story about Johhny Mullagh and Australia's first international touring sports team -the first XI Aboriginal cricket team at Harrow.

- ★ Stop at the Lavender Café and shop. The lavender arthritis cream is amazing. Relax with a cuppa or enjoy browsing in the shop, before returning to Berri.
- ★ Chocolate lovers will be delighted to visit "Chocolates and More" shop at Monash. Walk across the road to the Monash Adventure Playground and see the changes made to the playground over the years. Now a clean and pretty picnic area.

Bright Autumn Festival

Thursday 2nd to Tuesday 7th May 2024 - 6 Days

Accommodation: Bendigo, Myrtleford, Swan Hill

Highlights of the tour:

- ★ Relax and enjoy the beautiful autumn leaves as you make your way through the pretty Adelaide Hills and then through to country Victoria.
- ★ Visit the Talking Trams station in Bendigo. Alight the tram and take an interesting and "rattly" tour past Bendigo's impressive city buildings, landmarks and monuments. Learn about the early gold mining era in Bendigo and how it shaped the rich heritage of the town.



- ★ Travel through country Victoria to Glenrowan. This is in the heart of Ned Kelly country home of Australia's notorious bushranger.
- ★ Visit the Ned Kelly Museum and see one of Ned Kelly's suits of armour. Step back in time as you enter Kate's Cottage and see a replica of the Kelly Homestead and old Blacksmith Shed.
- ★ Enjoy a scenic drive around Bright and along the banks of the Ovens River to see the beautiful Autumn leaves before you stop to enjoy the Bright Autumn Festival Gala Day. The main street area in Bright is closed to traffic today so the rest of the day is yours to explore the streets, the many market stalls and purchase your own morning tea and lunch.
- ★ Travel to the historic town of Beechworth which is one of Victoria's best preserved former gold mining towns and explore the Beechworth Historic Precinct, including the old courthouse, old gaol and the Burke Museum, which was named after Robert O'Hara Burke, the Beechworth Police Superintendent. Walk the 19th century streetscape recreation "Street of Shops".
- ★ See the impressive Hume Dam (formerly the Hume Weir), one of the major dam across the Murray River in the NSW Riverina region. Walk across the dam wall for spectacular views east to Lake Hume and west to the Murray River. Lake Hume holds six times more water than Sydney Harbour.

★ Visit the town of Benalla with elegant Victorian-era buildings, museums and gardens. It is close to the infamous Ned Kelly gang shootout at Stringybark Creek.

- ★ Enjoy free time in Echuca on the River Murray on the return journey.



Highlights of the tour:

★ Every year between May and August, Giant Australian Cuttlefish migrate to shallow waters near Whyalla to breed. This is a unique spectacle and not replicated anywhere else. Thousands of cuttlefish make this journey. They grow up to 60 centimetres long and can weigh up to 5 kilograms. They have the unusual ability to change shape and colour to match their surroundings. The males even turn a fluorescent blue to attract a female mate. They are gentle creatures and don't mind sharing the ocean with others, including us.



- ★ OPTIONAL/ALTERNATIVE TOUR; Instead of seeing the cuttlefish from the glass bottom boat, you may wish to snorkel with them instead. You must be a confident swimmer and be able to walk over beach rocks to get to the water, walk through the shallow water with flippers on and swim out to a depth of approximately 3 metres. Wet suits and liners are provided. A qualified guide accompanies you. Cost for the optional/alternative tour is \$100.00 per person.
- ★ Other highlights include: Pt Germein jetty, once the longest jetty in South Australia, and still 1500 metres long.
- ★ Visit Hummocks Hill Look Out at Whyalla at sunset and see the amazing colours over the round jetty, the town and the Steel Works.
- ★ Visit the Whyalla Maritime Museum and learn about the Whyalla Steel Works and ship yards and ship building during World War Two.
- ★ Tour of HMAS Whyalla, the first ship built at Whyalla during WWII.
- ★ Visit Mount Laura Homestead Museum at Whyalla.
- ★ Morning tea provided on Day 1


Christmas in July at Port Pirie

- ★ Say goodbye to the beautiful town of Port Pirie and head to Port Broughton, a town located on the east coast of the Spencer Gulf. Explore the town in the comfort of the coach before we make our way to Bute. Have time to visit and admire the beautiful painted silo depicting the local flora, fauna, agriculture and young woman representing women in the country areas. Bute's historic railway station, local orchids, rainbow bee-eater birds and a blue wren also feature in the large scale mural.

★ As we travel along the Yorke Peninsula, we will stop at Kadina to see the local painted water tower which depicts a maypole girl holding copper and wheat, representing the Cornish history of the town, a steam train

for the rail that ran alongside the tower and poppies for a soldier

memorial.

Sealife, Seafood and Street Art of Eyre Peninsula

Sunday 25th to Saturday 31st August 2024 - 7 Days

Highlights of the tour:

★ Travel north stopping at Port Wakefield for morning tea near the first of our murals depicting the local industries and events .

- ★ Continue on to see more murals at Snowtown, including the water tower celebrating John Hansen, a CFS volunteer for 25 years. We stop for a delicious two course lunch at Pt Pirie.
- ★ Once we reach Pt Augusta you are now officially at the top end of Eyre Peninsula. The last leg of the journey today finishes at Whyalla where we will see plenty of street art.
- ★ Head inland for our first stop at Kimba, home of stunning colourful silo showing a young girl standing in a wheat field overlooking a vivid purple sunset. See other street art depicting local history.
- ★ On to Wudinna with more street art, before a stop at Pildappa Rock, part of the Gawler Ranges and a rock with the highest and longest wave formation on the Eyre Peninsula.
- ★ Minippa has our next lot of street art, this one being a circular toilet block called the "Concrete Crappa".
- ★ We finally arrive at Ceduna, on the shores of Murat Bay with the port of Thevenard 3 kms to the west.
- ★ We will do a tour of the town street art before settling into the Ceduna Foreshore Motel, our home for the next two nights.
- ★ Will the whales turn up this year? Let's find out. We will travel to the Head of the Bight with it's beautiful rugged coastline and maybe see the Southern right whales off shore from the purpose built lookout.

If the whales do migrate into Fowlers Bay then we may go there instead, but we won't know until a few weeks before, they are wild creatures and are unpredictable.

- ★ Enjoy a picnic lunch at this iconic site.
- ★ Stop at Penong to look at the outdoor Windmill Museum showcasing old, new, big and small windmills including "Bruce" the biggest windmill in Australia. It's a tribute to the farmers "whirling workhorses" that have nowadays mostly been replaced by solar panels.
- ★ Say goodbye to Ceduna and follow the coastline stopping at our first seaside town of Streaky Bay.
- ★ See the bronze statue (unveiled in 2022) of local boy Kieren McEvoy, winner of three Melbourne Cups.
- ★ Continue onto Murphy's Haystacks, Inselberg formations made of pink, massive rock consisting mostly of quartz and orthoclase. They are so named because a traveller in a coach saw the formation in the distance and asked how a farmer could produce so much hay. The farm was owned by a man called Murphy.
- ★ More sea life to view at Pt Labatt, the only permanent sea lion breeding colony on mainland Australia.
- ★ Sea lions are one of the world's rarest seals and less than 12,000 survive in the wild today.
- ★ Travel on through Pt Kenny and Elliston (with it's huge wall of street art) and finally arrive at Pt Lincoln for the next two nights.
- ★ Take a two hour Calypso Seafood Bay Cruise leaving from Lincoln Cove Marina.
- ★ Hear about life of a fisherman with firsthand knowledge of fishing, aquaculture and the colourful local history of bringing seafood to your plate. Sample some of their catch as well.




Sealife, Seafood and Street Art of Eyre Peninsula - Continued

Accommodation: Whyalla, Ceduna, Pt Lincoln

Highlights of the tour:

- ★ Visit the Axel Stenross Museum. See the video about the Finnish carpenter who sailed the mighty oceans on his windjammer SV Olivebank, reaching Pt Lincoln in 1927 and decided to make this place home. Learn about the lost craft of wooden boat building.
- ★ Moving on we will take you to visit the unique Rhapsody in Wood. See the beautiful works of art made from natural Australian timbers as they create these stunning maps. A unique trade and a must to see.
- ★ Lastly we will see the street art and sights of Pt Lincoln on beautiful Boston Bay. See the statue of Makybe Diva, the first horse to win 3 consecutive Melbourne Cups in 2003, 2004 & 2005. View the statue of Matthew Flinders and his cat Trim.
- ★ Time to leave Pt Lincoln in the rear vision mirror and make our way up the coast with our first stop being Tumby Bay, where street art is everywhere. Each year they have "The Colour Tumby Festival" which
 - includes live painting, with well known artists coming to Tumby Bay to add to the colour of the town. Of course they have a beautiful painted silo as well showing two boys jumping off the Tumby Bay Jetty.



- ★ Whilst here we add to our seafood part of the tour with a visit to Turners Oyster including a talk and tour about how the oyster industry operates. Turners Oysters is one of the original family operated farms and supplies fresh oysters, whole or opened, smoked or pickled, oyster kebabs, oyster pies and Kilpatrick or mornay oysters for sale.
- ★ We arrive at Whyalla where we will take you to Hummock Hill for a panoramic view of the city and the circular jetty.
- ★ On our way back home our first stop is Pt Augusta at the top of the Spencer Gulf, before travelling onto Pt Pirie to visit one of the best museums in South Australia "Stories of the Road Museum".
- ★ Morning tea provided on Day 1
- ★ Cooked or continental breakfast on Days 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7
