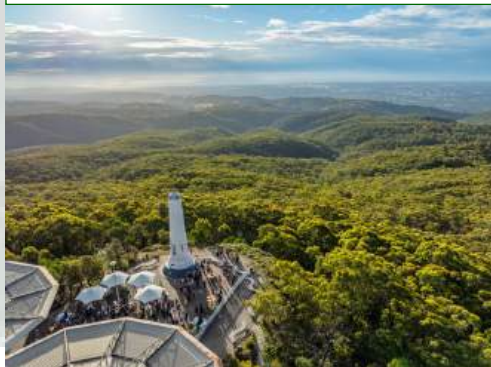

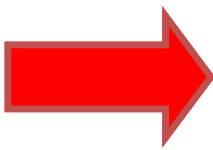

- ★ Just off the coast is Middle Island, home to a small colony of Little Penguins, made famous by the 2015 movie Oddball, based on a true story of the struggle to protect the Penguin colony and the Maremma sheepdog who helped protect them from the foxes.
- ★ Go to Cheeseworld at Allansford to taste and maybe purchase some of their amazing cheeses.
- ★ See the old Fletcher Jones & Sons Factory site which now houses the Fletcher Jones Market.
- ★ Travel to Hamilton and wander the Botanic Gardens
- ★ Visit the Sir Reg Ansett Museum at Hamilton, based in the Ansett' Company's original aircraft hangar, with over 1,000 objects relating to the Ansett empire from humble road beginnings to air transport.
- ★ Stop off at Tower Hill Lookout for a beautiful panorama of the area and maybe see some of Australia's best loved wildlife.
- ★ Call into the Kelpie Centre at Casterton, birthplace of the Kelpie working dog. The annual Casterton Kelpie Festival is held each year now.
- ★ Lunch at Naracoorte on your way home.

- ★ Leave Adelaide behind on this 7 day adventure. After morning tea at Taillem Bend and lunch at Bordertown, we cross into western Victoria and visit the Heritage listed Stick Shed at Murtoa, built as a massive grain storage facility in the 1940's .
- ★ Travel on through Ballarat and Melbourne, reaching Sale for our second night out. Sale is home to the famous Roulettes.
- ★ Spend two nights at the coastal town of Lakes Entrance as we tour the sights and take a cruise with Peel Cruises starting from the harbour to Metung where we will alight and enjoy a 2 course lunch before returning via the scenic waterways.
- ★ Lakes Entrances if predominantly a fishing and tourism town, 320kms east of Melbourne, near a managed artificial channel connecting the Gippsland Lakes to Bass Strait.
- ★ Visit the Griffith Sea Shell Collection with exhibits of marine life and coral plus an aquarium.
- ★ Stay at Beechworth, famous for it's major growth in the gold rush days in the mid 1850's. It has many well preserved historical buildings and Robert O'Hara Bourke, of the ill fated Burke and Wills expedition was stationed at Beechworth as Senior Inspector of Police in the 1850's
- ★ Visit the Ned Kelly discovery hub at Glenrowan, an insight into the 1800's and the Ned Kelly gang.
- ★ Walk the streets of Rushworth, another Victorian gold mining town.
- ★ See the stunning five painted silo's at Colbinabbin
- ★ Stop at Lake Boga, where during WW II a secret airbase was located near the town. Lake Boga was a RAAF flying boat maintenance facility during the war and a PBY Catalina flying boat is on display.
- ★ Our last night will be at Swan Hill, home of the Giant Murray Cod.
- ★ Tonight we will experience the laser light show "Heartbeat of the Murray" at The Pioneer Settlement.
- ★ We will travel back home via Sea Lake, Ouyen & Murrayville with lunch at Lameroo.
- ★ Morning tea provided on Day 1

- ★ After crossing the border into Victoria see the beautiful painted silos at both Kaniva and Goroke.
- ★ Travel further north and visit Sheep Hills Grain Corp Silo art which depicts the indigenous people of the area.
- ★ Stop at Lascelles and see the ghostly silo art depicting a fourth generation farming couple of the area.
- ★ See the Kaff-eine Horse Mural at Beulah. Kaff-eine is an artist from Melbourne who has done several works in the area, commonly depicting farm life.
- ★ Stop at the Mighty Murtoa Stick Shed at Murtoa. This is the only stick shed left in the world. It was built in 1941 to store loose wheat.
- ★ Visit wood’s Farming and Heritage Museum at Rupanyup and enjoy a picnic lunch.
- ★ Visit Spanner Man at Boort. He may have passed on but his Spanner Man Garden Sculptures live on for all to see.
- ★ Visit the Aussie Beer shed and listen to the owner give a very enthusiastic and funny talk about the place.

Sail and See the Giant Cuttlefish

Tuesday 1 to Thursday 3 July 2026 - 3 Days

Accommodation: Whyalla

Highlights of the tour:

- ★ Every year between May and August, Giant Australian Cuttlefish migrate to shallow waters near Whyalla to breed. This is a unique spectacle and not replicated anywhere else. Thousands of cuttlefish make this journey. They grow up to 60 centimetres long and can weigh up to 5 kilograms. They have the unusual ability to change shape and colour to match their surroundings. The males even turn a fluorescent blue to attract a female mate. They are gentle creatures and don't mind sharing the ocean with others, including us.
- ★ See these amazing sea creatures from the comfort of a glass bottom boat. Watch them swim, change colour and mate (if you're lucky).
- ★ **CAUTION;** *You are required to walk over large flat rocks to get from the shore to the boat so you must have reasonable balance. It is approximately 30 metres and not in the water. There is a hand chain for support but you must be able to manage this almost by yourself. There will be people there to support you if required. It is not suitable for people with walkers or walking aids.*
- ★ Other highlights include: See the Pt Germein jetty, once the longest jetty in South Australia, and still 1500 metres long.
- ★ Visit the Whyalla Maritime Museum and learn about the Whyalla Steel Works and ship yards and ship building during World War Two.
- ★ Tour of HMAS Whyalla, the first ship built at Whyalla during WW2.
- ★ Enjoy a walk on Whyalla's unique circular jetty which was opened in 2020 and is the only circular jetty in the Southern Hemisphere.
- ★ Visit Mount Laura Homestead Museum at Whyalla.
- ★ Stop at Wirrabara and see the beautifully painted silo.
- ★ Morning tea provided on Day 1
- ★ Continental breakfast on Days 2 and 3
- ★ Lunch on Days 1 and 3
- ★ Two course dinner on Days 1 and 2

Whale Watching, Sealife and Seafood of Eyre Peninsula

Sunday 2 to Saturday 8 August 2026 - 7 Days

Highlights of the tour:

- ★ Travel north stopping at Port Wakefield for morning tea near the first of our murals depicting the local industries and events .
- ★ Continue on to see more murals at Snowtown, including the water tower celebrating John Hansen, a CFS volunteer for 25 years. We stop for a delicious two course lunch at Pt Pirie.
- ★ Once we reach Pt Augusta you are now officially at the top end of Eyre Peninsula. The last leg of the journey today finishes at Whyalla where we will see plenty of street art.
- ★ Head inland, stopping at Kimba, home of the Big Galah. You are now at the half way mark across Australia.
- ★ On to Wudinna before a stop at Pildappa Rock, part of the Gawler Ranges and a rock with the highest and longest wave formation on the Eyre Peninsula.
- ★ Minnipa has an unusual circular toilet block called the “Concrete Crappa”.
- ★ We finally arrive at Ceduna, on the shores of Murat Bay with the port of Thevenard 3 kms to the west.
- ★ We will do a tour of the town before settling in to the Ceduna Foreshore Motel, our home for the next two nights.
- ★ Will the whales turn up this year? Let’s find out. We will travel to Fowlers Bay for a unique whale watching cruise and see the beautiful creatures up close. *If the whales do not migrate into Fowlers Bay then we will travel to Head of the Bight instead, and see them from the viewing platform.*
- ★ Enjoy a picnic lunch along the way.
- ★ Stop at Penong to look at the outdoor Windmill Museum showcasing old, new, big and small windmills including “Bruce” the biggest windmill in Australia. It’s a tribute to the farmers “whirling workhorses” that have nowadays mostly been replaced by solar panels.
- ★ Say goodbye to Ceduna and follow the coastline stopping at our first seaside town of Streaky Bay.
- ★ See the bronze statue (unveiled in 2022) of local boy Kieren McEvoy, winner of three Melbourne Cups.
- ★ Continue on to Murphy’s Haystacks, Inselberg formations made of pink, massive rock consisting mostly of quartz and orthoclase. They are so named because a traveller in a coach saw the formation in the distance and asked how a farmer could produce so much hay. The farm was owned by a man called Murphy.
- ★ More sea life to view at Pt Labatt, the only permanent sea lion breeding colony on mainland Australia. Sea lions are one of the world’s rarest seals and less than 12,000 survive in the wild today.
- ★ Travel on through Pt Kenny, Elliston (with it’s huge wall of street art), Coffin Bay and finally arrive at Pt Lincoln for the next two nights.
- ★ Take a harbour cruise leaving from Lincoln Cove Marina. Hear about life of a fisherman with firsthand knowledge of fishing, aquaculture and the colourful local history of bringing seafood to your plate.

Accommodation: Whyalla, Ceduna, Pt Lincoln

More Highlights of the tour:

- ★ Visit Constantia Woodworking and Organic Finishes. See the beautiful handcrafted pieces made by this family business that has been around since 1977.
- ★ Lastly we will see the street art and sights of Pt Lincoln on beautiful Boston Bay. See the statue of Makybe Diva, the first horse to win 3 consecutive Melbourne Cups in 2003, 2004 & 2005. View the statue of Matthew Flinders and his cat Trim.
- ★ Time to leave Pt Lincoln in the rear vision mirror and make our way up the coast with our first stop being Tumby Bay. Each year they have "The Colour Tumby Festival" which includes live painting, with well known artists coming to Tumby Bay to add to the colour of the town. Of course they have a beautiful painted silo as well showing two boys jumping off the Tumby Bay Jetty.
- ★ Make a quick visit to Arno Bay and then on to Cowell with it's painted silo of local identity Lionel Deer and his camel Diamantina. Lionel bought camels to the local Christmas Pageant for over 30 years.
- ★ Whilst here we add to our seafood part of the tour with a visit to Turners Oyster including a talk and tour about how the oyster industry operates. Turners Oysters is one of the original family operated farms and supplies fresh oysters, whole or opened, smoked or pickled, oyster kebabs, oyster pies and Kilpatrick or mornay oysters.
- ★ We arrive at Whyalla where we will take you to Hummock Hill for a panoramic view of the city and the circular jetty.
- ★ On our way back home our first stop is Pt Augusta at the top of the Spencer Gulf, before travelling on to Pt Pirie to visit one of the best museums in South Australia "Stories of the Road Museum".
- ★ Morning tea provided on Day 1
- ★ Cooked or continental breakfast on Days 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7
